Rules Change - Declaring Blanks Effective immediately

- 7.1 Blanks must be declared in writing on a neutral sheet of paper (such as a results slip). Where both blanks occur in the same word, their order must be made clear, on the paper used.
- 7.2 The player of a blank must record it before pressing the clock. If they do not, the opponent may immediately restart that player's clock, requesting that the blank be properly declared.

New South Wales

Club News

No new clubs have come on board since the last issue, but interest has been expressed in forming affiliated clubs at St Marys, Mona Vale and Berowra. Maitland club has been moved to unaffiliated status due to its inability to supply four members, the requirement in NSW for affiliation status. Scrabble NSW carries the insurance liability of its members and affiliated clubs, of which there are now 18. A new membership card is being developed to simplify the process of joining players in affiliated clubs who attend more than once. This will depend on the co-operation of the club co-ordinator.

AGM

The AGM of Scrabble NSW was held during lunchtime of Day 2 of the State Championships on 5th October. We thanked Graeme Lock Lee for his efforts while on the committee and welcomed in his place Victor Tung. No

nominations were received for the position of Vice President which has been left vacant.

The Epping Club Experiment

The format of the Epping Club competition held on Sunday 2nd November proved successful, and one that could be duplicated in future events, especially where Scrabble NSW runs the event on behalf of the host club.

In this event there was a rated Social Division, essentially for lower rated members, social members and newbies. In the Social Division, access to 2 letter words was allowed, the games were untimed and flat boards were used. It was found that three games could be comfortably played by the social group in the time it took the other Division to play 4 games. This meant that everyone broke for lunch at the same time and everyone finished at the same time, leading to only one set of presentations.

It is hoped to duplicate this format with a tournament hosted by Newcastle Club early in 2026

State Championship Summary

37 players attended the three-day event at Revesby Workers Club with a further 24 attending the one-day event on the Sunday. Edward Okulicz from Victoria won the event for the third consecutive year, with Graeme Lock Lee winning the one day event. Nathan Tang, one of Sydney's youth brigade took out the Joan Rosenthal award for the second year running, gaining 443 ratings points over the 12 months culminating in the State championship

Queensland

Queensland ran tournaments in Townsville, Toowoomba, Noosa and Brisbane during the last quarter. Queensland players also competed overseas with six at the World Seniors event in Berlin and five at the Continental Championship in Budapest. Karen Richards was awarded the 2025 Seniors 70 to 74 World Championship. Carmel Dodd was the highest finishing Australian in the World Seniors Championship. (her age group was won by Mike Baron USA who finished second overall)

Three Queenslanders competed in the World Youth Scrabble Championship held in Malaysia. They acquitted themselves well, with all of them gaining WESPA ratings. Thank you for representing us, Ashwin, Danira and Shukanya.

Townsville Scrabble Festival was held from 9th August until 17th August – 6 days of Scrabble over 9 days and 4 events. The Australian Women's Championship had 41 players with Sally Martin was crowned the 2025 Australian Women's Champion. The two one-day tournaments on Magnetic Island were also well attended with 46 people taking part. The final event of the Festival was the

Queensland Championship with 60 people competing.

Cameron Farlow is the 2025 Queensland Champion. This is the eighth time in a row and eleventh time overall Cameron has won the title. Well done Cameron!

The Australian MENSA Convention was held in Brisbane in October. A session talking about the benefits of Scrabble was presented by youth player Oliver (NSW) with assistance from his mother Sarah Klistorner and Karen Richards. Well done Ollie!

The second Noosa tournament had 34 players including 4 novices and 9 provisional players. Players came from Northern NSW to Bundaberg. Due to forecast severe weather, five other novices withdrew on the day, but said they would go to the Noosa club meetings. The event was promoted with Facebook advertising with those indicating 'interested' personally followed up. This has proved to be a successful way of attracting new players. Congratulations to Sheryl Davidson for winning the event.

Western Australia

On 17 August, the team at the Bassendean Scrabble Club hosted its annual ASPA WA tournament for 2025. The club offered various prizes including alcohol (probably wine), cookies, chocolate bars, and shopping gift cards, which were awarded via raffles, the Word of the Day which was AUGUSTE, High Word and Game categories, and top three placings. The seven winners from the Word of the Day competition were Anne Zion, Ian Ting, Marge Roberts (twice), Anne Stewart, and Louise Love (twice). The winners from the High Word and Game categories in Divisions A and B as well as the top three placings in both divisions were David Vanzvl (twice). Benjamin Lee, Geoff Shepheard, Anne Zion, Delys Carbon, Pauline Coulter (twice), Vera Etherton, and Naomi Zion.

Four Western Australian representatives made their pilgrimage to Melbourne, Victoria for the Australian Masters and State Team Challenge on the first weekend of September. In the Australian Masters tournament, David Vanzyl placed ninth in a field of twenty with ten wins out of nineteen. In the State Team Challenge which featured twenty-one players representing seven of the Australian states (or territories), Sally Martin placed fourth with twelve wins, Benjamin Lee placed ninth with ten wins, and Geoff Shepheard placed twelfth

with nine wins. Collectively, Western Australia placed third among the states (and territories) with a total of thirty-one wins.

The fifth edition of the Glenys Lawrie Memorial Open was held on 14 September, with the winner having their name engraved on the Glenys Lawrie Memorial trophy which models a lorry transporting a plethora of Scrabble tiles. After seven games, the minor winners for the High Word and Game categories, and third and second placings were Henny Yates, Ian Ting (twice), and Geoff Shepheard, while the winner for first place and the Glenys Lawrie Memorial Open champion for 2025 was Faye Williams, who joins the exclusive club of only a handful of Memorial

Open winners in the history of Western Australian Scrabble and has her name engraved on the trophy. From the Press and Publicity Officer of Scrabble WA, "Faye, you're a Scrabble champion".

The next tournament hosted by Scrabble WA was the October Bisection on the 5th. A number of high scoring plays and games were featured from several players including scoring four or five bonuses in a game, games scoring above 500 and word plays scoring above 100. In A Division, the winner for first place and completing a clean sweep for the first time in his Scrabble career with seven out of seven was lan Ting, who ascends to a personal best ASPA rating of 1654. Meanwhile, in second place was David Vanzyl with five wins and a massive +886 point margin, and in third place was Benjamin Lee with five wins as well. David and Benjamin share the High Game category with 535 points, while Edie Mueller claimed the High Word with **SEDIMENT** for 140 points. In B Division, the winner for first place was Donna Sekkouah with six wins and a +262 point margin, while in second place was Rhonda Reynish with six wins as well and a +221 point margin. In third place was Joanna Moss with four wins, who also claimed High Word with **TWERKING** for 98 points. The High Game was claimed by Alan Mathews with 502 points. Scrabble WA thanks the volunteers and the

avid Scrabble players who resiliently attend regularly to these tournaments with vibrant enthusiasm and aplomb.

Australia sent a team of 14 to the twentieth iteration of the World Youth Scrabble Championship - the largest team since the halcyon days when we had three World Youth Champions (David Eldar 2006, Anand Bharadwaj 2010. and Michael McKenna 2012).

For 2025, the top 6 players (who qualified for free entry) were Oscar Ivanovski (Vic), Ashwin Page (Qld), Nathan Tang (NSW), Ryder Lo (NSW), Kelvin Korn (NSW) and Jithuni Vidanaparath (Vic).

Oscar put the world on notice by rising to the top of the field and holding the number 1

position for many rounds, but was unfortunately relegated to 11th overall. In a field of 218 players, that is still a great achievement.

Three of our team were prize winners in their respective age categories; Ryder Lo (Under 12). Oliver Klistorner (Under 10) and Justin Eng (Under 8).

Australia and Pakistan were the only countries who fielded players in all age groups. We were very proud of all youngsters for their sportsmanship and tenacity in competing against the best youth from around the world. All players (and their parents) enjoyed making international friends.

Traveller's Tales

I signed off last edition in this column as we left Peru on this year's trip of a lifetime. While eveything is still fresh in my mind, the story continues...

We did a couple of short city drives around **LIMA**, the capital of Peru from our berth in the port of Callao. There is no walking out of the port which is heavily guarded, even passport checking on the bus on our return.

Our guide admitted that corruption is a way of life there, but they are on to it, with a reported four ex presidents doing jail time. The current president whizzed past us, we were told, on her way to lunch, holding up us valuable tourists. And I believe that she is also now an ex president awaiting investigation.

Lima has the distinction of it never raining, Donkey's Belly, that is grey, is how it is described, hardly ever seeing the sun, still no rain to speak of.

Pisco is further down the coast where it really does not rain, ever, unless you call 0.2mm annually rainfall. A long bus trip from the Port into the city has desert on either side of the road, nothing ever grows there. This is the start of the Atacama Desert usually associated with **CHILE** a short distance away.

The city of **PISCO** is quite compact with hotels, restaurants, **GEEGAW** stalls lining a narrow strip along the water. Backpackers and other hardy travellers are catered for with diving, snorkelling, sailing, all on offer. New resorts are being built. An international airport brings the tourists in.

As can be expected, things are expensive which didn't deter our fellow passengers from loading up their suitcases with yet more stuff.

From Peru it was a long haul across the **PACIFIC**, on the itinerary as a stop, was Easter Island, no landing, just to circumnavigate the Island and wave to the residents.

We had our customary games of Scrabble while we circled Easter Island. In view of the MOAI statues, Colleen played MOAI against me. I am going out on a limb here and guess that never in the history of Scrabble has that word been played while viewing the definition.

Commentary from on board told us the Moai were carved in the quarry then walked in a waddling motion to their display site. I know it works, I've seen it in use in the buffet on the ship. For those old enough to remember, an ABC identity once noted that the Moai bore a striking resemblance to the caretaker Prime Minister of 1975, Malcom Fraser.

There is one flight a day in from Chile and same day flight out. The plane must carry enough fuel to arrive at Easter Island then turn back if landing is too dangerous.

Pitcairn Island is even smaller but supports 50 or so people. It has no airport, so a medical emergency entails a 36 hour boat trip to French Polynesia, we just sailed around it.

Tahiti, is that nearest bit of civilisation, and being French territory, it has a high standard of living, nice houses, well stocked supermarkets, great coffee.

Moorea across the water from Papeete is a heartbreakingly beautiful island, featured in the movie *South Pacific*. Coral reefs, majestic peaks. I don't think I could live there, though, I couldn't find a Scrabble Club. The nearest one would be in Auckland, the final stop on our journey home.
