AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIP

Congratulations to David Eldar, once again taking out the Championship (2003 (Plate); 2007, 2013, 2024 and 2025). Just as well that he won it – he forgot to bring over to S.A. the Perpetual Trophy!

Olga Visser claimed the top prize in the Plate division, a successive win for her also. Max Mason took out the Chris May Memorial Board with a ratings gain of 98 points and Jithuni Vidana (9 y.o.) was the best performing youngster.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP & WORLD YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIP

The qualification period for the World Youth Championship (30 August – 1 September, Malaysia) and the World Scrabble Championship (formerly WESPA Scrabble Championship) (11-16 November, Accra, Ghana) end on May 30. We are looking forward to strong representation in both championships.

Unfortunately, the long-awaited Teams event which was planned to precede the World Championship was cancelled with various countries citing travel arrangements, costing, too much Scrabble as reasons. WESPA (the World English Speaking Players Association) will be looking to a more central venue for the event, likely in Asia.

Growing interest in Youth Scrabble

We are pleased with the burgeoning youth Scrabble scene in Canberra, with a northside club meeting regularly on Sunday afternoons under the tutelage of John Hamilton (Australian Youth Scrabble Coordinator), and a weekly after-school club in the southern suburbs with the oversight of Lexia Smallwood.

It has been good to have youth players playing in our monthly tournaments, and to have one of our young players among the small ACT contingent to Adelaide at Easter for the Australian Championship. Karen Richards (Australian Youth Coach) presented a one-day Youth Coaching Workshop on 30 March, and provided shorter coaching sessions to youth players in the few days prior to the ACT's first Youth Tournament on 10 May.

Tournaments

Our tournament on 22 February attracted 16 players, including 5 novice players, of whom 3 were aged 13 and under. The first three places went to (1st) John Hamilton with 8 games out of 8, (2nd) Rebecca Hill with 5 wins, and (3rd) Tim Reddan with 5 wins. John Hamilton took out both the high game (548) and the high word (SCODIER) for 110. Finally, Lexia Smallwood set a new ACT and National record for the longest word played (12 letters – ALPHABETISES) noting that Arlene Williams set it up with ALPHA and then extending to ALPHABET in prior moves.

It was lovely to have three of the novice players from our February tournament (Sam Pizzano, Cecilia Willis, and Hugh Boveington) return to compete again in our next tournament on 29 March. All place-getters won 6 games out of 8: Tony Hunt placed first, John Spaan second, and Noel Barrett third. Noel Barrett earned both high game (552) and high word (PROPANES) for 149.

I am pleased to report a new club has been started on Central Coast at Toukley. The club was kicked off by Scrabble tragic Sandra Elliott who already convenes the Ourimbah Club. The new club meets on Fridays from 10pm to 2pm at The Ary, a licensed club operating in Toukley.

Also on the Central Coast, Empire Bay and Terrigal Clubs have indicated they do not wish to remain affiliated with Scrabble NSW so have been moved out of our main list of affiliated clubs. South West Rocks club, despite still operating is another club now moved out of our main list.

Upcoming Tournaments

A new tournament format is being planned due to a venture instigated by The Epping Club, a licensed club in Sydney's northern suburbs, on Sunday June 22nd. The plan is to have a social group running alongside an elite group, the latter basically made up of tournament regulars.

The social group will come from The Epping Club membership and anyone else wanting to take part in an unrated competition. It is likely the social group will be given our two-letter word list, and not use clocks. There will be generous prizes on offer for all as an incentive to join in for a fun day of Scrabble.

Revesby Club has been booked for the Chris May Winter Masters on July 26th and 27th. The tournament will be internationally rated, with two overseas players already entered. Trevor Halsall has indicated he will return to defend his title and it is hope Chris' widow Ksenia will again present the perpetual trophy to the winner.

Tournament Summary

Only five rated events were held during the quarter, stretching from Lake Macquarie near Newcastle in the north to Bomaderry near Nowra in the South.

The first of these was the Wollongong Summer Tournament on 22nd February. 40 players contested Round Robins in groups of 8, with Divisional winners being Joanne Craig (A), Janine Whittaker (B), Lexie Neale (C), Nathan Tang (D) and local Menchie Lowe (E). Josh Watt, tasked with manually recreating some pairings, achieved high word score of the day with MANLIEST for 140, while Ryan Sutton had the highest game score with 559.

The next event was The Matchplay Qualifier at Burwood on March 1st. There were Two Divisions, above and below 1300, with the top 8 in each to go through to the head-to-head playoffs. In A Division, Josh Watt and Rod Talbot were the top 2 finishers while in B Division Richard Birch and Steven Savona were the top 2. John Barker achieved the highest game score of the day with 526 while Bob Jackman shad the highest word core of 131 for GLADIOLE.

Next our regulars went south again, this time to Bomaderry on March 16th. A certain NSW President celebrated his birthday on the eve of the event in the Bowling Club dining room. Next day 32 player gathered at the venue in four Divisions to be ably directed by John Hamilton.

Divisional winners were Joanne Craig (A), Steven Savona (B), hostess Margaret Neal (C) and local player Greg Hopson (D). High game went to Joanne Craig with 571 with Dorothy Fields from Wollongong scoring the highest play of the day with **SQUARER** for 110.

Two weeks later we moved to the Birch Residence in Lake Macquarie, where 22 players contested an Open event of 8 x 20 minute per player games. 22 players were spoilt by the Birches with superb catering and barbecue lunch prepared by our host between games.

Eventual winner was Josh Watt with 7 wins, with Bob Jackman and host Richard Birch taking the minor placings. Bob scored both high game of 586 and high word of 131 with **ESTRIDGE**. Prizemoney was given to the

highest rating gainers which were Donna MacDonald (+48), Richard Birch (+39) and Krystyna Batten (+38).

The last event for the quarter was Tony Hunt's Lansvale Mindsports. Karen Richards visited from Queensland to coach some of the youngsters attending the event, comprised mostly of students but with a smattering of experienced players.

Tracy Bui who has been cutting her teeth at Petersham Club won three out of her four games as a novice to impress in her first outing. The top three placings of the 26 players were organiser Tony Hunt, winning all 4 games, Josh Watt and fast-improving youth player Nathan Tang.

Queensland

Queensland has started using Facebook advertising to attract people to clubs and tournaments. Adverts target areas near the tournament or club venue, with those indicating an interest being followed up and encouraged to attend. So far, the results have been promising with 15 novices coming to tournaments since the beginning of the year.

Twelve Queenslanders attended the Australian Championships in Adelaide at Easter. Olga Visser won the Plate division. They all had a great time and look forward to going to the ACT next year.

The Nambour tournament on the Sunshine Coast was run successfully with 34 players including 7 novices, making it the largest field so far this year. Many thanks to Ruth Jones for organizing the event.

Another Sunshine Coast tournament will be run in Noosa on 24th May. This is being organized by Megan Marks who was one of the novices at the Nambour event. Megan has been running a scrabble club at Noosa for a while and was unaware of Scrabble Queensland until the Nambour event was promoted via Facebook.

Scrabble Queensland is again running programs as part of the Brisbane State High School Enrichment Program, an after-school activity that runs for 6 weeks in both terms 2 and 3. We have 2 regular players now that came from last year's programs. The program commences on 12th May.

Scrabble Queensland continues to run Mindsport events. These are aimed at youth and beginners. They typically have a short coaching session followed by a short tournament. Events have been held in January and April, with the next one planned for 15th June aimed at youth from the Brisbane State High School Enrichment Program.

This year's Queensland Championships will be held in Townsville in conjunction with the Australian Women's Championship with up to 6 days of scrabble from 9th August to the 17th August 2025. We look forward to seeing lots of people there.



As seen on its numberplates, Adelaide is South Australia's 'Festival City'. I only made the move from Perth last year but even so, I am always reminded why it has this moniker, amazed how there is always something going on, advertisements for the next JAMBOREE, FIESTA or BEERFEST.

FESTIVALGOERS come far and wide from across town but also interstate and beyond to have a gander. It revs up in March when no sooner have the Christmas and New Years' celebrations subsided and leftovers polished off when MAD MARCH as it's known (which has its own stodgy anagram) comes around. A festival of festivals, it's a vibrant flurry of the arts, culture and events. DRAGSTERS rev at the Adelaide 500, PROSATEURS come for the Adelaide Writer's Festival. It's all topped off by the crown jewel, the Adelaide Fringe Festival, the largest of its kind in the Southern Hemisphere, where DIVAS, FUNNYMEN and TRUSTAFARIANS meet in the parklands for well, any show you could imagine.

I even remarked that there was an EGALITY in the air, world-class acts like the bombastic Ross Noble performing metres from the streetside daredevil and stuntman STUNTING and OUTSTUNTING the next MANKINI-clad HARLEQUIN next door. One could mosey about the Garden of Unearthly Delights and Gluttony for days on end, go from spritely CANCANS to a measured, insightful PLENARY to a surprisingly tasty VEGEBURGER to a pop-up art display filled with GALLERYITES.

It was oddly reminiscent, then, when we packed up the last trestle of the South Australian Scrabble Championships (held in March, of course) only to get back into tournament mode for the Australian Championships. Going from the state champs to the Nationals, plus the intermittent tournaments and weekly club play, this March and April has felt like our own FRINGELIKE festival of Scrabble, and the traditional Easter weekend of competitive word-slinging was the perfect way to top it all off.

103 keen, canny Scrabblers from all of Australia's states and territories (and beyond) descended on Adelaide – Glenelg, to be precise. Play took place at the Holdfast Bay Bowls Club. In a delightful twist of coincidence, the 2025 Australian PETANQUE Championships were being lobbed into action just a few hundred metres up the road. Glenelg played host to a weekend where strategy wore two different hats, one dictionary-thick, the other broad-brimmed.

A most unlikely curveball came when tournament director James Gunner was sidelined with a bout of rhinovirus shortly before the tournament commencement. Fortunately, the tournament remained in the capable hands of Nick Ivanovski along with computer operator extraordinaire Lachlan Vnuk to ensure everything ran smoothly from clock start to challenge call.

Round 1 commences with that familiar chorus of tile rattling. Coming off his major victory at the City of Sydney Masters, Josh Watt romps ahead with six bingos, VERANDAS, SCROUGES, SIZEABLE, HEREUNTO, NAILSET and NONGLARE, getting to a final score of 587 and putting him firmly in front. Michael Vnuk plays WINNING for 90 – a sign of things to come?

In my first game, I am I drawn to play Cameron Farlow who won the championships in 2019. I draw the bag and get ahead with SIGNAGE, SNOTTIE, MORALIST and QUERIDA to win 524-399. The draw for Game 2 is put up only for everyone to find out it is identical to Game 1's. Back to the breakout room, everyone. Standby.

Funnily enough, my dumb luck followed me for the first day and much of the tournament. I somehow managed to go 7-2 on Day 1, putting me in second place. Personal highlights of the day included PROGERIA, AZOTH (81) and SIZZLER. Jane Taylor has a cracking game against Martin Waterworth, bingoing out with her third bingo of MARTINET to win by 276. Against Cameron, Adam Kretschmer extends his PATIENT with OUTPATIENT. No, that's not to surpass in patience.

I am reminded that Scrabble tournaments, particularly larger ones this one, produce a distinct, percussive ambience of tile clicks, clock clacks and counting. It is nostalgic and familiar. What is just as familiar are the game-to-game CHINWAGS. The breakout room is alight with intense discussion and recapping of the last game's foibles, 'Well, she had everything', 'I missed NEOBLAST' and the always heartbreaking 'I had a word but nowhere to put it down'.

The lively discussion is accompanied by a lovely CUPPA and the wonderful catering work of Jacqui Pearce and Margaret Gibson who worked at an amazing pace, delivering plate after plate of CRUDITES and CANAPES. They even surprised us with ice-cream cones towards the end of the day, a South Australian tradition I'm told. I'm not sure how that started, but it was a darn good idea.

After three days of hotly contested competition, it was a case of Scrabble déjà vu where both the Championship and Plate winners of the previous year ascended to retake their titles again in unison! In the Championship, a familiar face in Victoria's David Eldar triumphed commandingly with 20 wins, four games ahead of the runners up. A three-time world champion and now four-time Australian champion, Jane jokes that David's forgetting to bring the 2024 trophy back this year was an elaborate gamble, one that paid off.

It was Queensland veteran Olga Visser who returned to stake her claim, and that she did! Olga won the 2024 Plate with 16.5 wins, and she came back and outdid herself with 18 wins! She edged out New South Wales's Margaret Neal (also 18 wins) by just over 100 spread points. Frank Csarics rounded out the top 3 on 16 wins. South Australia's Judy Mansfield won the high game with an impressive 584 while Queenslander Anne Hough's OVERAGES for 158 took the high word.

The Championship's top 3 was rounded out by South Australia's own Adam Kretschmer in second and Victorian Trevor Halsall in third. Adam also took out the high game prize of 639, while David Eldar and fellow Victorian Geoff Wright tied for the high word with GINGERED and INTERVAL respectively for 158.

As someone who started playing as a youth, now at best an ADULTESCENT, I have to mention how fantastic it was to see such a

strong bevy of young people contesting this year's event with Oscar Ivanovski in the Championship and Maheu Papau T-Pole, Lev Roch, Danira De Silva, Sam Pizzano and Jithuni Vidana in the Plate. Nine-year-old Jithuni (Victoria) won the overall youth prize with 10 wins – well done Jithuni! Speaking about the YOUTHQUAKE, one insider source told me:

"I was really impressed by them. They were unfailingly polite and curious and good humoured. They remained enthusiastic the whole time and were a delightful addition". The Chris May Memorial Prize for highest rating gain went to yours truly, picking up 98 rating points.

Of course, it would be remiss of me not to extend a big thank you to Nick Ivanovski and Lachlan Vnuk, Michael and Rowena Vnuk for their name tag and scorebook designs, Antony Kimber, Susan Roberts, Judy Mansfield, Tony Miller and Daniel Piechnick of the committee, caterers Jacqui Pearce and Margaret Gibson and all who assisted with the set-up and set-down. Biggest of all, thank you to our efficient, invaluable state president Jane Taylor for leading a coordinated committee effort to put on a successful and memorable tournament.

If you're feeling FRINGY next March, drop into Adelaide for the weekend and play some Scrabble while you're at it! The torch now gets passed on to Canberra who will host the 2026 event. See you there!



They are made of plantation hoop pine and are approximately 30cm x 30cm. The tiles were quite easy to pick up and place on the board which was projected onto the floor. (Although this clumsy author has to confess to accidentally standing on an opposing team's word and hopes to be invited back with no hard feelings!)

The board is approximately 5m x 5m.





The judging team AKA Ministers of Alphabology did a fantastic job of bringing tiles to each team, timekeeping and word checking.

The purpose of this immensely fun event was to raise money for the not for profit charity, 'I Am Someone'. This is a local charity which creates projects aimed at lifting children with no family support out of extreme poverty, focussing on four different communities in Africa. They raised \$2500 on the night, which is an incredible effort.


