Tournament Summary

The first tournament for the quarter was the Lake Macquarie Spring event held on the 30th November, the last day of spring! Again the Birch residence on the shores of the beautiful Lake Macquarie was the venue. Some of us were pleased to renew our friendships with Rex Shakespeare, who made the trip from Melbourne in his camper-van. A small celebration was held for John Barker, the most prolific games player in Australia who had recently reached octogenarian status. Josh Watt won seven out of his 8 games to win, going only down to Greg Pinchbeck by 2 points. Bob Jackman finished second and Rocky Sharma third in the field of 20.

The next event was the Central Coast Summer, not quite as far north out of Sydney as Lake Macquarie. This event was organised by Sandra Elliott of the Ourimbah Club, who could not play due to a recent operation. Josh stepped up to run the event and still manged to take out the honours in A Division from Tony Hunt. In B Division Janine Whittaker was victorious over Vinh Nguyen while in C Division youth player Nathan Tang won over local stalwart Donna Macdonald.

The always popular JanBoree tournament kicked off 2025 on January 4, with 49 players contesting round robins in groups of 10. Karen Richards made the trip from Queensland to test out the local opposition in Division A, which was won by Victor Tung from Rod Talbot. Jeremy Yip made a rare appearance to finish third and achieve high game of the day with a score of 578. Tim Reddan made the trip from Canberra to win Division B, losing only one game, with Therese Nichols from Wollongong Club in second place. In Division C ATB Editor Richard Birch also only lost one game to take the honours from Pam Bennett. while in Division D Yvonne Edwards prevailed over Sandra Elliott. Finally, in Division E, David Lam won with 8 wins with Liz Jackman finishing in second place.

The City of Sydney International Masters was our final event for the quarter. This is one of our three majors for the year, internationally rated and with generous prizemoney. This year it was held in immaculately renovated space within the Revesby Workers Club, with 42 in attendance including 13 from interstate. Andrew Fisher from Victoria was gunning for his 7th title while young Oscar Ivanovski also from Victoria was making his first appearance in this major and would finish in the top 10. Fadlan Satria from Victoria was also a first time visitor and we met Diyath Visidagamage

now resident on the New South Wales South Coast for the first time. Unfortunately local fancy Esther Perrins was a late withdrawal due to a positive COVID test.

The tournament went down to the wire with Josh Watt needing to win his last game against Rvan Sutton to clinch his first major title. This he did with relative ease to finish one game clear of Cameron Farlow from Queensland who had superior spread. Josh finished with 14 wins out of the 18 games played, a commendable effort for someone who has only being playing competitively for just over one year. The top 5 was rounded out by the three players on 12 wins being Andrew Fisher, Joanne Caig and Ryan Sutton. The high game for the event was 610 achieved by Noel Barrett in the first game while the high word was 167 for **SCOOPING**, achieved by Bob Jackman in the second last game.

Matchplay Finals

Both A and B Division Matchplays were completed during the quarter. In B Division Steven Savona defeated Andrew Smith 5 games to 4 in the semi-final , then went on to lose the final to Assanka Dissanayake who won 6 games to 3. In A Division Esther Perrins easily accounted for John Holgate in their semi-final then went on to beat Bob Jackman in the final 6 games to 2. The 2025 Matchplay Qualifier has been scheduled for March 1st at Club Burwood RSL.

Live Streaming Project

At its committee meeting in December, Scrabble NSW agreed to investigate the viability of live streaming games in the manner done by the New Zealanders in the recently completed Trans-Tasman Challenge in Auckland. At time of writing, not a lot of progress has been made, but John Hamilton has agreed to assist with the project where possible. A You-Tube channel is being set up, probably to be called Oz Scrabble. It is expected that historical footage from the 2009 Australian Scrabblers in Action CDs will be placed there, to complement future streaming and other miscellaneous content from around Australia.

Trans-Tasman Challenge

Eight New South Wales players took part in the bi-annual Trans-Tasman challenge held in Auckland in November. They were Assanka Dissanayake, Rocky Sharma, Ryan Sutton, Chris Ostrowski, Rod Talbot, Esther Perrins, Victor Tung and Bob Jackman. New Zealand convincingly beat Australia for the first time since 2010, with Russell Honeybun from Western Australia being the top Australian performer. The 2026 Trans-Tasman Challenge will take place in Queensland.

Bob Jackman was granted a Medal of the Order of Australia for services to competitive Scrabble on Australia Day.

Here is a list of some of the reasons why he was deemed worthy of this prestigious award.

He was instrumental in setting up the Australian Scrabble Players Association (NSW) (incorporated in 1996), hereinafter referred to as Scrabble (NSW), but has been involved in scrabble for over 30 years. He has been a committee member since incorporation and President for the majority of that time.

He set up and moderated the ozemail scrabble list for over 25 years.

He set up the Scrabble NSW website in 1993 and has continuously maintained it since then (<u>https://www.scrabble.org.au/nsw/</u>).

He set up the Scrabble NSW Facebook page (<u>https://www.facebook.com/aspansw</u>).

He set up the Australian and World Scrabble rating systems and maintained them free of charge for over twenty years.

He set up the Chatswood Scrabble club (where I met him and Liz in March 1993) and has assisted new clubs in NSW.

As President of ASPA (NSW) he is instrumental in the organisation of many tournaments – particularly the annual NSW Championship and the National Championship when it is held in Sydney. He has created a checklist for tournament directors but is still frequently required to assist with adjudication and software due to his longstanding experience.

He and John Foster (NZ) were cofounders of the biannual Trans-Tasman Challenge (TTC) after a discussion at the World Scrabble Championship in London in 1995. The first TTC was first held at the Macquarie Street Hotel in Sydney in 1996. The Australian Team won with Bob winning the Best Player Award presented by Derryn Hinch. The TTC has been held every two years thereafter with the exception of 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Following the most recent TTC in Auckland in November 2024, the Bob Jackman Trophy will be presented to the Best Australian Player in line with the NZ practice of presenting the John Foster Trophy to the Best NZ Player.

He was instrumental in setting up and jointly running the annual Tri-state Challenge and Kempsey Cup Challenge.

He set up the annual City of Sydney International Masters which is held on Australia Day weekend and was still running and competing in it when his award was announced.

He contributes to the development of Scrabble in Australia through his representation on CASPA (the Council of Australian Scrabble Players), as President of Scrabble (NSW) and attendance at tournaments. He has played over 7000 rated tournament games in Australia.

He is six times NSW State Champion, twice National Champion, finalist in the Asia-Pacific Championship (1998) and has represented Australia at numerous World Championships.

He has published many Scrabble books used as learning aids worldwide.

Bob led the NSW Committee through the challenging time of the coronavirus pandemic in 2020 and came up with novel solutions such as playing in small groups in people's homes when regular tournaments were not able to be held.

I nominated Bob for the award in February 2021 so it was a lengthy process. The referees were contacted by the Secretariat last year: John Holgate (Treasurer and longstanding committee member of ASPA (NSW)), Dr Ivor Zetler, Greg Pinchbeck and Howard Warner (NZ). John Holgate's input was invaluable as he was already playing competitive scrabble in Sydney when they met thirty-four years ago at the beginning of Bob's journey.

It was John who noted that the Medal of the Order of Australia had been awarded to exceptional individuals for their dedication to chess (to Cecil Purdy and Peter Parr) and bridge (to Tim Seres). We are delighted that Bob has been awarded this medal for services to competitive Scrabble!

Scout Jamboree

26th Australian Scout Jamboree Maryborough Qld, January 2025

Four members of Queensland Scrabble volunteered to introduce Scrabble to Scouts aged 12+. Karrin Henderson, Olga Visser, Paul Richards and Karen Richards stayed in a Maryborough hotel (not allowed to camp on site with the youngsters) for 8 days.

They devised a program which included a "learning" module to introduce the various apps, explain how moves are scored etc, and then play a consensus game with the help of Quackle.

Other options included "free play" where they played with their friends, and we oversaw/ guided these games. Some older Venturer Scouts were delegated to assist us. One of their major contributions was to lead out in multiple games of "Anagrams" (a simplified version of the game enjoyed by top players around the world).

Any Scout who could already play was invited to "challenge a Master". Up to 6 games were played simultaneously by one Master player. Every hour (42 of them!), the master player would reward the most impressive player with a tee-shirt declaring "Scouts make **MOUNTAINS** out of **ANTIMUONS**" plus "scrabble.org.au." Some of these Scouts were quite good. When asked how they learned to play, they responded with "my grandmother/ my mother/ my teacher".

None of them said they had learnt by playing online/apps. This surprised us, as we assumed youngsters would find playing on a phone or tablet to be fun. We had included a "quiet corner" equipped with a Scrabble app set up on iPhone and iPad. Only a handful of Scouts chose this activity.



While this sounds very organised (and we were!) the execution was somewhat chaotic. Where we had expected Scouts to stay with us for at least an hour, many of them were only in the tent for 30 minutes, because they had appointments with 3D Printing etc.

We did have a problem with timing – we provided a wall clock, but didn't realise that most youngsters could not read a standard clock. Hence our neighbour, Dr Stephen Dann (lecturer from ANU who works with Lego) took on human-alarm-clock duty every 30-minutes to warn Scouts that the next sessions were starting with 3D printing etc.

The planning for this exercise began two years ago, when a local Scout leader (Matt Buxton) played a fundraising tournament for Ashwin to compete in World Youth Championship. He was excited about how many skills were involved in Scrabble. I asked if he could help take Scrabble to the Scouts. He approached Scout leaders to include Scrabble in the STEM (Science, Technology Engineering and Maths) discovery centre (recognising the mathematical base of our game).

Some other Scout leaders were surprised about this inclusion. However, we did have over 1300 Scouts visit our tent to find out what Scrabble is about, so it was relatively popular, considering our seven areas of competition (Rocket launching, 3D Printing, Lego, Soldering, Robots, etc).

Overall, we had 179 Scouts who volunteered their email addresses so we could follow up with them – inviting them to join clubs/ tournaments etc. In hindsight, it may have been better to ask for phone numbers, because young people don't appear to check their emails.

John Hamilton had responses from over half the ACT contacts, but other states are finding it harder to reconnect with those on their lists. Already, we have one ACT Scout who has committed to participate in the Youth Scrabble camp running in conjunction with Australian Championship in Adelaide, plus others who have expressed an interest.

The next Scout Jamboree will be held in NSW in 3 or 4 years time. Hopefully we will be invited back.
